**REMOVAL OF RHODES PLAQUE, FRONT FAÇADE 6 KING EDWARD STREET
OXFORD**

Thank you for your enquiry as to whether any consent is required for the removal of the Rhodes plaque from the front façade of 6 King Edward Street.

Whilst the plaque is recognised as having interest it has no specific designation or protection in its own right. It is not attached to a listed building and listed building consent would not be required for its removal. In terms of any need for planning permission, it is not considered that its removal would constitute substantial demolition in a conservation area (the relevant legal test), and therefore planning permission for its removal would not be required.
